RECORDER'S CORNER

What a crazy ride the month of April and May has brought to the Isis Shrine. There were both good and not-so-good things that took place. So, with further ado, here we go!!!

On April 29, 2021, the Isis Shrine Temple was broken into and robbed. The suspects broke in through the back door and broke into all of the offices. The suspects took \$900, \$4200 in gift cards, internal PA system, portable PA system, liquor, 2-cash counting machines, 2-iPads, and destroyed many computer items. It is estimated that with damages and items stolen, the cost amounted to approximately \$40,000. Our internal camera system did catch the suspects on film, and the hard drive has been turned over to the police. I have spoken with the police and detectives working on this case, and on May 5, they had a suspect in custody. If you have any questions about this, please reach out to me or any Divan member to get the most accurate information. As I receive new information, I will do my best to keep everyone up to date with this case.

Now for the good stuff. A Spring Ceremonial was held in Scott City on May 1, bringing in four new Nobles of the Isis Shrine. There was also a circus that the Isis Shrine was able to sell coloring books during the show. We are hoping that the Isis Shrine will be able to sponsor this event next year. Shriner History

In 1870 a group of Masons gathered frequently for lunch at the Knickerbocker Cottage on Sixth Avenue in New York City. At a special table on the second floor a particularly fun-loving group of men met regularly. Among the regulars were Walter M. Fleming, M.D. and William J. "Billy" Florence, an actor. The group frequently talked about starting a new fraternity for Masons – one centered on fun and fellowship, more than ritual. Fleming and Florence took this idea seriously enough to do something about it.

Billy Florence had been on tour in France, and had been invited to a party given by an Arabian diplomat. The exotic style, flavors and music of the Arabian-themed party inspired him to suggest this as a theme for the new fraternity. Walter Fleming, a devoted fraternity brother, built on Florence's ideas and used his knowledge of fraternal ritual to transform the Arabian theme into the Ancient Arabic Order of the Nobles of the Mystic Shrine (A.A.O.N.M.S.).



With the help of the Knickerbocker Cottage regulars, Fleming drafted the ritual, designed the emblem and costumes, formulated a salutation and declared that members would wear the red fez.

The first meeting of Mecca Shriners, the first temple (chapter) established in the United States, was held September 26, 1872. As word got out about the fledgling organization, membership grew rapidly, spreading across the U.S. In the early 1900s, membership spread into Canada, Mexico and Panama.

The Fez

The fez is one of the most recognizable symbols of Shriners International and was adopted as the Shriners' official headgear in 1872. Named after the city of Fez, Morocco, the hat represented the Arabian theme the fraternity was founded on. It also serves as an outward symbol of one's membership in the fraternity. Much like the white apron worn by Masons as a symbol of their brotherhood, the fez is worn only by Shriners as a symbol of their membership in this unique fraternity.

Today the fez is worn at Shriners' functions, in parades and at outings as a way of gaining exposure for the fraternity. Members customize their fez to show their allegiance to their temple. Look closely at a fez and you will also learn other important information about its wearer, such as membership in Shrine clubs, special roles within the organization and much more. Each fez is custom made and a Shriner may own more than one fez depending on his activities and memberships.

P.P. III Sir Mark Smith (2018) started a program during his year as Potentate where Nobles, Ladies, Units, Clubs, or anyone, could make an obligation to donate \$100 a year for 3 years. When they made this obligation, they were recognized with a lapel pin and a certificate showing their membership. This program brought in much needed revenue for the Temple. Since the 100K Club was such a success, the ISIS Shrine Divan has decided to expand this program to 150K and 200K Club's. The ability to become a member of any of these Club's are:

100K-Commitment of \$100 a year over 3 years, or all at once (\$300). After the last payment is received, a pin and certificate will be presented.

150K-After completion of 100K, a commitment of \$150 a year over 3 years, or all at once (\$450). After the last payment is received, a pin and certificate will be presented.

200K-After completion of 150K, a commitment of \$200 a year over 3 years, or all at once. (\$600) After the last payment is received, a pin and certificate will be presented.

*If someone wants to join all 3 levels at once, they can pay \$1300 and save \$50. If present 100K members want to join the 150K and 200K all at once, they can pay \$1000 and save \$50.



Mia – National Patient Ambassador, Shriners Hospitals for Children

Mia, 16, was born with a severe case of infantile idiopathic scoliosis. Her journey with Shriners Hospitals for Children began when she was 2, when she was first seen at the [St. Louis location](#). Mia's treatments have included halo traction to gradually straighten and stretch her spine, as well as nearly 20 surgeries.

During her extensive time in the hospital, Mia and her care team developed a tight bond, and Mia considers the people she knows at Shriners Hospitals – her doctors, nurses, therapists, and even the security guard – family. She has served as a patient ambassador for Shriners Hospitals for Children – St. Louis since she was 4 and has spoken to numerous audiences on behalf of the hospital. She has also appeared in promotional videos and media interviews. Mia's passion is theater and singing, and she was featured singing *I'll Be Home for Christmas* in our holiday commercials. Mia is also part of the Shriners children's choir that performed in a recent recording of Foreigner's hit song *I Want to Know What Love Is*.



Connor – National Patient Ambassador, Shriners Hospitals for Children



Connor, 14, was born with a bilateral incomplete cleft lip and complete cleft palate involving the hard and soft palate. As a newborn, his condition was so severe that he was even unable to create the suction needed to feed. By the time he was 3 weeks old, he was failing to gain weight and was about to be admitted to a hospital. That's when Connor's family learned about [Shriners Hospitals for Children – Chicago](#).

There, his RN care manager gave his mother, Kelly, a special syringe, making it possible for her to finally feed her baby. And from that moment, Connor began an extensive treatment plan of surgeries and interventions that extends until he is 21, so that some repairs can be made after he has stopped growing.

Children's Hospital Travel Fund: Money can be donated to this account which helps pay for the expense of travel for the patient and one parent. This is to help alleviate the pressure of trying to budget in travel expense. It is used to cover flights, gas, hotels, and food. This expense is usually split between a club in the area of the patient and the Temple. If there is not a club in the area to help with the expense, the Temple pays for the entire trip. This donation is tax deductible for whoever is donating.

Building Maintenance Fund: Money can be donated to this account, and it is put back for when repairs to the building are needed. This helps to ensure that the building is kept up and operational. A donation over \$100 will get the person(s) or organization(s) name on the plaque located in the Temple. This donation is not tax deductible.

Principal Program: Money can be donated toward this and is deposited into the General Fund. Every quarter, a payment totaling all donations will be made toward the principal of the loan on the building. This program was set up to help pay the building principal off in an expedited manner. There are four different levels that a person(s) or organization(s) can donate to. They are Bronze (\$100-\$500), Silver (\$501-\$1000), Gold (\$1001-\$2500), and Platinum (anything over \$2500). When a person(s) or organization(s) donates to one of these levels, their name will be placed on a plaque located in the Temple. This donation is not tax deductible.

General Fund Donation: Money can be donated toward this fund and it will be used for the daily operation of the Temple. This covers a large amount of expenses that are generated throughout the year. This donation is not tax deductible.


